This product is Dual N-channel MOS Field Effect Transistor designed for Li-ion battery applications and power management applications of notebook computers.




TEST CIRCUIT 2 GATE CHARGE










FORWARD TRANSFER ADMITTANCE vs. DRAIN CURRENT




DRAIN TO SOURCE ON-STATE RESISTANCE vs. GATE TO SOURCE VOLTAGE




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



GATE TO SOURCE CUT-OFF VOLTAGE vs. CHANNEL TEMPERATURE





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
















